URL Redirect

- URL redirects create server-side 301 redirects.
- 301 is the status code that means a page has moved to a new location.
- 301 Redirect are Permanent Redirects.

When do I use URL Redirects

- You moved platforms and have a different URL structure or file name (ex: .html vs .asp)
- You want to make sure links to outdated URLs are redirected to the correct pages.
